Original Research/Review Paper Post Peer-review & Upon Receiving an Editorial Decision

Evaluation of editorial and reviewers` comments

The Steps to the **Decision-Making Process** by authors to establish the permissibility of removing one or more co-authors during the revision of an original research or review article, without exposing them to ethical or legal misconduct.

All co-authors are advised to convene to collectively review the decision and the editorial and reviewers' comments.

One or more co-authors wish to remove their names from the article due to a potential conflict of interest.

*

Conflicts of interest can arise among authors, or between authors and the handling editor or reviewers, due to new job conditions of some authors, financial interests, personal relationships, or competing research interests during the paper processing.

All authors of the article agree with the removal of one or more co-authors?

The authors should withdraw the article without exposing themselves to ethical or legal misconduct.

The removal of one or more co-authors is permissible and is classified as an acceptable practice.
